Name Badges - NFARL is now offering what we think is one of the finest looking name badges in the ranks of Amateur radio. It is 2" x 3", and has a magnetic pin back so as NOT to poke a hole in your shirt. They are absolutely smooth with no etching or routing of the lettering. These are \$9 each and takes about 2 to 3 weeks to receive them once ordered. The reason for the 2 to 3 week delay is that we wait for a number of orders to accumulate, then send them off to Chaz Cone W4GKF for design, and he then sends the order off to the manufacturer where they are assembled and then mailed to your home address when completed.
