

A net meets every Sunday night at 8:30PM on the downtown Roswell repeater - 147.06 (PL 100). You do not have to be a

member of the group to check in or participate in the training. You do <u>**not**</u> have to be a NFARL member to join NFARES.

NFARES Simulated Emergency Test - October 25, 2009

North Fulton Amateur Radio Emergency Service Members (NFARE) and all North Fulton Amateur Radio League (NFARL) members are invited and encouraged to help with the upcoming 2009 Simulated Emergency Test (SET) scheduled for October 25, 2009 between the hours of 3:00 and 6:00 p.m.

As you can see from the diagram of the exercise we will be establishing multiple communications networks to cover the five cities in North Fulton county as well as the Fire/Rescue, Police, hospitals and potential shelters that might be utilized during a real emergency.



We are looking for volunteers to establish VHF/UHF analog and digital communications sites as follows:

<u>Alpharetta</u> - 6 Fire Stations, 1 Police station, 1 Hospital and 1 shelter for a total of 9 locations. <u>**Milton**</u> - 3 Fires Stations, 1 Police headquarters and 1 shelter for a total of 5 locations.

Johns Creek - 3 Fire Stations, 1 Police headquarters, 1 hospital and 1 shelter for a total of 5 locations.

Roswell - 7 Fire Stations, 1 Police headquarters, 1 hospital and 1 shelter for a total of 10 locations.

Sandy Springs - 4 Fire Stations, 1 Police headquarters, 1 hospital and 1 shelter for a total of 7 locations.

As you can see we need approximately 40 volunteers to successfully conduct this exercise. Volunteers will need to provide their own communications equipment, with at minimum, two meter VHF analog capabilities. Additional information on the mission and plans for this exercise will be discussed at the October 13th NFARES meeting which will be held at the Sandy Springs City Office Complex at 7:00 p.m. and at the next NFARL meeting scheduled for October 20, 2009 at the Roswell Masonic Temple. Jim Stafford W4QO and a team of NFARES members have prepared the plan and will assist in the coordination of the exercise. Be sure to sign-up for a slot and help with these Emergency Preparedness efforts. Remember, no experience is necessary to participate. Think of it only as a training and learning experience.
