President's Corner





Recent Activities:

Sandy Springs Cycle Challenge held Sunday May 2. NFARES Members, organized by Tom Koch, W4UOC, and NFARL members participated in this day-long event by spotting emergencies or problems from locations on the course and communicating back to net control. One unique feature was two net control stations, one operated by Mike, AD4MC for the 60 mile Metric Century course, and Sheila, KD4NKE, for the short loop. Assisting in the Metric Century Route were Doug, N3AiA, and Jim, AB4CZ, on motorcycles! This proved very valuable as Doug was able to find and redirect cyclists who got off course as well as reporting other problems and breakdowns. The event organizers and public safety officials were impressed with our communications capabilities and skills and spoke to that often during the event.

Next Meeting: The next scheduled meeting is Tuesday May 11 7:00 PM at the Sandy Springs Municipal Complex. Watch the Yahoo Reflector for the exact room location. The topic will be cross-band repeat with a full demonstration. This feature allows a hand held radio to cross-band connect to a mobile or base station which provides greater power and range. This operating technique is available to most anyone with dual band UHF-VHF dual receive radios. ARES uses this operating capability at the communications center at ChatComm (911 Center) and it was used quite effectively during the Sandy Springs Cycling Challenge. Come see how it works and how to set this up with your own equipment.

The Antenna Special Interest Group (AntSIG) is in its 5th month now, and the first lesson for the month addressed feed line "SWR". The group completed the 4th month of study on transmission lines and baluns with a hands-on testing and demonstration session on May 1. The session was lead by Jim, K4DLI and Chuck, AC4CW, with an able assist from Rich, KB7WO. There were 21 AntSIGers in

Technician HAMCRAM – June 12

The date for the next Technician Ham Cram has been set for <u>June 12</u> at Living Science Home Studies, Inc., 4095 North Arnold Mill Road, Woodstock, Georgia 30188-4571. Start time will be 8 AM, and an array of instructors will be present to answer questions and go over the material one more time before the test session. Testing will begin at 3:30. Cost is \$25 and will include the test, snacks, lunch and drinks. Participants for the Technician Ham Cram can register and pay for the session at the NFARL Mart on the club web site, <u>www.nfarl.org/mart</u> Payment can be made by Check or Pay Pal. <u>The cut-off date for registration and payment is May 28, 2010</u>. Please let everyone you know that the Ham Cram is going to take place, and remember our success rate is over 99%! A comprehensive set of on-line learning experiences will begin 3 weeks before June 12, and links to the Questions and their answers that are standard on the test will be posted for those interested in the Technician Ham Cram on May 29.

The goal this session is to assign a mentor to each one of the graduates, and encourage them to get on the air and also take their General test in the late summer (time to be announced).

Field Day 2010: Field Day is now less than two months away. The Field Day Team continues its diligent work to make this the best Field Day in NFARL history. One of the major areas where we still need help is with runners, shift captains, talk-in operators, and people to help collect all the bonus points we can get. Clyde, KJ4MIJ, sent out a notice on the reflector last week asking for people to step up and help. These are all extremely important positions, so please help as



much as you can. Runners are responsible for going to the gas station for generator fuel, the grocery for ice and drinks, the doughnut shops to replace coffee, and any other errands that need to be run off-site. Shift captains are the go-to people for their shifts. They conduct safety and fuel checks on the generators and answer questions and handle issues if one of the team is unavailable. For bonus points, we could use people to sign up for such things as getting the W1AW bulletin and passing NTS traffic during Field Day. Talk-in operators will run talk-in for the event. As you can see, these are all important areas. I am also working on getting T-shirts ready for sale. The art for the shirts is on the NFARL web site, in the Field Day section. Congratulations to Edward Doyle and Erin Lemmon on submitting the winning artwork. Once I have all the details for T-shirt sales finalized, I will post a note on the reflector.

Contest news

The first monthly contest completed on April 30 and the winner was ...John Kludt K7SYS. For May, we will hunt the old foxes. Here are the rules again.

MAY contest starts 1May and ends 31May. This contest is called "Hunt the old foxes". You get a point for each day you make a QSO. You get a bonus point for each old timer (25 years of hamming). You also get a bonus bonus points for every 10 years after that. Since I got my ticket in 1955, I'm worth 5 points (1 for the QSO, 1 for the quarter century and 3 for the next 30 yrs). This means that your QSO's will have to be a little longer to get this info and you might even have to use a calculator to figure your score! Same rules about one contact a day counting, not using the internet to look up stuff, no repeat QSO's with the same person and all modes/all bands eligible. Steve K4ZPF, Contest Manager


