

A team of 16 NFARLites demonstrated the international scope of ham radio to hundreds of visitors to the International Day event at the Johns Creek NE/Spruill Oaks Library on Saturday, March 26.

Using a vertical antenna and 100-watt transceiver, club members and visitors contacted 36 countries using the club call sign NF4GA. The CQ Worldwide WPX SSB contest coincided with the event, so the bands were



active with stations from around the world calling CQ. We were pleased with the interest expressed by young and old alike but especially by the large number of youth who enthusiastically put on the headset and made contacts on their own.



The library staff was so impressed with our demonstration and the response of the visitors that we have been invited to present ham radio to a group of middle school students who meet there regularly. What a great way to introduce our exciting hobby to today's youth and their parents. Way to go,


Service Opportunities

NAMB will be holding a Simulated Emergency Test on May 17, 18 and 19.


