Yes, a Book Can Boost Your Signal / Keith Plossl K4KRX

I learned many years ago that my speaker quality limited my music listening quality. Sure, the amplifier played a role as did the quality of records and CDs, but even studio grade electronics make low-quality sound without studio-grade speakers. There seems to be a great similarity between speakers and antennas. The speakers transform an electronic signal into air-pressure waves. The antenna radiates power and receives signals back from distant locations. The antenna is key. As one NFARL ham put it, if you can't hear 'em, you can't work 'em.

To help our members hear 'em and work 'em, the library has several books on antennas and DXing. These books discuss the role of both low SWR (impedance matching) and far-field radiation patterns to help communications with distant stations. What does your north far-field pattern look like? When I got asked that question, I had no clue. I got that info on my G5RV antenna and learned my pattern varied depending on band and antenna orientation. A quick glance at an azimuthal map centered on Atlanta revealed that having a major pattern lobe headed north will help determine if India, Pakistan and Nepal are even possible as receive locations.

Our book of the month for September is Low Band Dxing - 4th Edition by John Devoldere ON4UN.

A ham donated it when the 5th Edition was published. The book covers far-field radiation patterns and achieving low SWR losses by impedance matching. Read this book and see if you get a broad-based understanding of antennas and transmission line matching for low band DXing. This is a great book, I'm told.
