Public Demo of Emergency Communications & BSA Merit Badge Workshop

The North Fulton Radio League (NFARL) will join thousands of Amateur Radio operators (Hams) who will be showing off their emergency capabilities at this event. Amateur radio operators provide critical communications during unexpected emergencies. When trouble is brewing, Amateur Radio's people are often the first to provide rescuers with critical information and communications - and is often the <u>ONLY</u> way people can communicate.

This annual event, called "Field Day" is the climax of the week long "Amateur Radio Week" sponsored by the ARRL, the national association for Amateur Radio. Using only emergency power supplies, ham operators will construct emergency stations in parks, shopping malls, schools and back yards around the country. Their slogan, "Ham radio works when other systems don't!" and "When all else fails!" is more than just words to the Hams as they prove they can send messages in many forms without the use of phone systems, internet or any other infrastructure that can be compromised in a crisis. More than 30,000 amateur radio operators across the country participated in last year's event.

There are many aspects of the hobby to explore ranging from using shortwave frequencies to communicating with people around the planet, setting up wireless data networks, or even bouncing signals off the moon. Showing the newest digital and satellite capabilities, voice communications and even historical Morse code, hams from across the USA will be holding public demonstrations of emergency communications abilities.
