NFARL honors Ham Teachers with new EDUCATOR class of membership

Starting immediately all active teachers who are licensed amateur radio operators may join NFARL for FREE! You must be a certified teacher with a current amateur radio license and be teaching in some capacity. Just go on the website into the MART page and fill out an application form. You do not pay dues but you must send an email to n4cla@nfarl.org explaining what you teach, where you teach, and any other info you'd like to offer about your work. And it goes without



saying that any teacher may ask for help of a ham radio nature from the club. We can provide speakers, mentors, and science programs if scheduled.

Ideas for your consideration - NFARL LOAN-AROUND PROGRAM by Jim Stafford, W4QO

As youth/school coordinator for NFARL, I would like to mention something you may not have thought about. We are getting many new youth members in the club (and also are assisting school clubs as well). In our excitement over meeting a new ham, we sometimes offer to give this new ham a piece of equipment, even a nice HF transceiver. This is certainly a great gesture, and you can <u>absolutely</u> do what you want with your equipment, but let me give you an alternative - donate the equipment to the NFARL club and let us administer it as part of our **Loan-Around Program** to the long term benefit of all concerned.

Here are some reasons why:

1. You may not be aware of all the youth/schools that we are working with or who have just come on board. Just because you hear of an "opportunity" that could use a radio, you may not be aware that four other "opportunities" that have been waiting longer, have more exposure, or have higher classes of licenses where the equipment could be more fully used. Even if you prefer to have the rig used in a specific situation, we can handle that for you - you can designate where you want the equipment to be used and we can make that happen.

2. People and schools move on and may acquire their own equipment of say a later vintage, or may (heaven forbid) lose interest. What happens to your equipment? If it is a loaner from the club, the equipment can be moved to the next "opportunity". Otherwise it is often stranded and sits on the shelf collecting dust. If you would like multiple examples, talk to me personally. I have been doing this for over 25 years.

3. Equipment may need minor (or major) repairs or instruction on using the equipment. Who will do this? Are you "close enough" geographically or capable of doing what's required to keep the

youth on the air. Equipment owned by the club will be managed by the club, perhaps even with a substitute rig during repairs or in many cases a simpler rig to use than the one you donate. It depends on the person and situation.

4. While not always a big thing for you - when you donate to the club, you can write it off your taxes as we are now 501c3. We'll give you a letter for your tax file.

5. We have equipment already in our "pool" that a person can use and we try to get the right equipment to the right "opportunity" so as to maximize the good for everyone. Will your rig also require an antenna tuner? We have some in our pool. How about a telegraph key? We have those as well. Mic? Same thing. Is your rig too complex to use in say a school environment?



This is just a friendly reminder regarding your NFARL and ARRL memberships. It has now been 59 weeks ago that we moved all of our membership to the <u>NFARL.ORG</u> web site from the QuickBooks environment. We have tried to make sure that all the bits and bytes are in their proper places for each membership record. You should now be receiving automatic renewal notification for your NFARL and ARRL memberships 30 days before your membership expires, and then one after it does expire. This should give you plenty of time to renew on line before your expiration occurs. However, as with all database migrations, there will be exceptions. If you feel that your name is not on the membership roles, and should be, or it is incorrectly categorized, please send a note to <u>n4cla@nfal.org</u> The other piece of this is that your name will automatically fall off the membership roles exactly 365 days after the expiration and the renewal is just added to the current expiration date. Please, if you change your email address or are not sure that it is correct, or you have a question about why you are not receiving notifications you can check this by logging into <u>www.nfarl.org/mart</u>. and verifying that your email address is correct
